### CONTEST RULES AND REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for the contest, the student must:

- Be a high school sophomore, junior or senior.
- Be a dependent of an active Otero County Electric Cooperative (OCEC) member.
- Submit the completed application, two (2) written short essays and one (1) letter of recommendation from school or community leaders.
- Participate in a personal interview. Finalists will be picked based upon written application and will be interviewed by the selection committee. A maximum of four (4) winners will be chosen after the interview process is complete.

### APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications will be considered when the following information has been received at Otero County Electric Cooperative:

1. Completed application with applicant's and parent/guardian's signatures.
2. Parent or guardian's current OCEC account number provided on the application (account number will be printed on most recent bill).
3. Two (2) essays—one (1) essay with topic chosen by OCEC; one (1) essay is the applicant's choice from three (3) suggested topics and with a minimum of 500 words.
4. One (1) letter of recommendation from school or community leaders.

The delegates selected to represent OCEC are required to travel with their state delegation for the full tour. The delegates are not allowed to travel independently from the delegation to, from or during the trip to Washington, D.C., except in the case of an emergency. In the event of an emergency, arrangements must be approved and will be coordinated through the New Mexico Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NMRECA). If a delegate cannot attend the entire Youth Tour, the delegate will be required to forfeit the trip and will become an alternate.

- B. Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of renewable energy sources, and how the widespread adoption of renewable energy could affect your electric cooperative and community.
- C. Growing up in a rural area has certain advantages, as well as disadvantages. Describe how living in south central New Mexico has influenced your development.
