Scholarships power student success

The Otero County Electric Education Foundation scholarship program provides area students the opportunity to further their education.

Since its inception in 1989, this foundation has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to our community's youth, awarding more than \$2.1 million in financial assistance. This exceptional level of support underscores the program's long-standing dedication to fostering academic excellence and career development.

Unmatched Financial Support for Long-Term Academic Goals

What sets this scholarship apart is its long-term financial structure. This program is designed to support students not just for their first year, but potentially throughout their entire undergraduate journey.

- **Initial Support:** Scholarship recipients receive \$1,500 per semester for their first two semesters. This initial award provides a critical boost, helping students cover the costs of entering a university, college or technical school.

- **Sustained Investment:** The value increases to \$2,000 per semester for an additional six semesters—up to four years

total—if the student maintains the required GPA and continues their enrollment. This escalating support is a powerful incentive for students to focus on their studies and ensure they have the sustained funding necessary to graduate with minimal debt.

This significant commitment to financial aid directly benefits students by alleviating the burden of tuition, books and living expenses, allowing them to concentrate on achieving their academic and professional aspirations. It's a true investment in the leaders and skilled workers of tomorrow.

Eligibility and Application Details

Securing this life-changing scholarship is straightforward.

- **Eligibility Requirement:** Applicants must be active members receiving electric service from Otero County Electric Cooperative. This ensures the funds are invested directly back into the families and communities served by OCEC.

- **How to Apply:** Students can pick up a copy of the application at OCEC offices, through their school guidance counselor, or download it directly at ocec-inc.com.

- **Deadline:** Don't miss out! The

deadline for submitting your application is March 16. Mark your calendars and prepare to take advantage of this opportunity.

In addition to the OCEC program, students can receive a scholarship through Basin Electric Power Cooperative.

This scholarship is for upcoming high school graduates who receive electric service from OCEC and plan to attend a post-secondary school in fall 2026.
